Trivia: Eid al-Fitr

TEACHER DIRECTIONS: Welcome to the Reading Vine’s Trivia Trail: “Trivia: Eid al-Fitr!” In this three-part journey, you’ll guide students through an informational reading, trivia quiz game, and an exit ticket where they can reflect on what they’ve learned and design their own trivia questions.

1. **READ** the “Trivia: Eid al-Fitr” informational reading together or assign it as independent reading.
2. **PLAY** the “Trivia: Eid al-Fitr” Trivia Quiz Game together as a class divided into small teams.

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Trivia: Eid al-Fitr

Directions: Eid al-Fitr, pronounced “eed-uhl-fee-truh,” is a celebration that marks the end of an event called Ramadan, which is part of the Muslim faith. Read the article below in order to prepare for the “Eid al-Fitr” Quiz Game! Underline important details as you read.

In the Muslim religion, people participate in an event called Ramadan. Ramadan is when people who are Muslim do not eat when it is light outside. This is called “fasting.” However, once the sun sets, people get together and enjoy big meals together. This happens for 30 days in a row.

On the last day, everyone is proud of their accomplishment. This begins the celebration of Eid al-Fitr. It lasts for several days.

In addition to eating together, people also exchange gifts. People also hang up lanterns. People even wear special outfits to celebrate Eid al-Fitr. There is also a tradition of telling stories. Sweet foods and treats are very popular.

In the year 2024, Eid al-Fitr will take place in April. However, the date changes each year.

Learning about Eid al-Fitr is a great way to celebrate and understand a special Muslim cultural tradition.
