- the figure is half human and half god



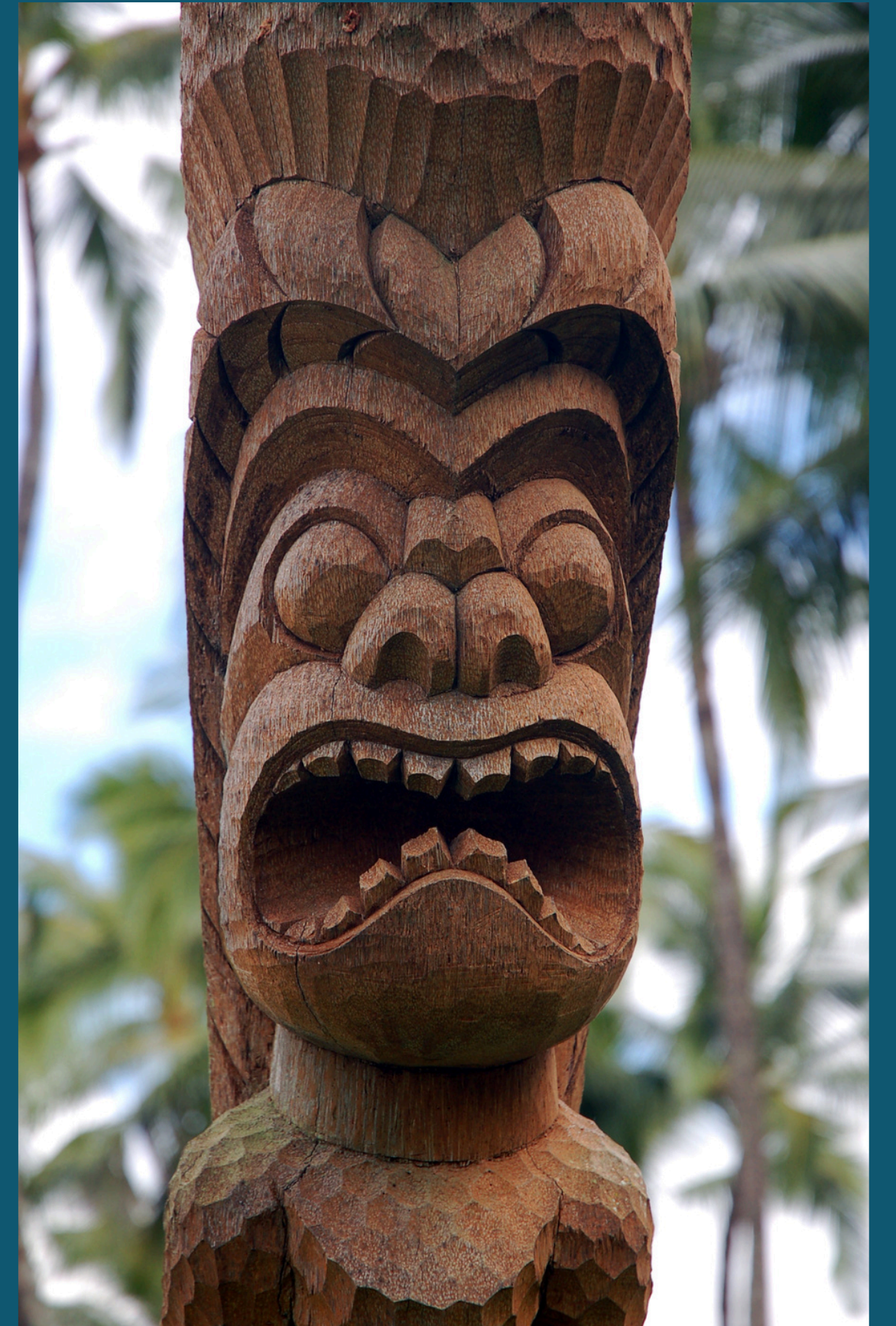
WHO USES TIKIS?
