## Introduction to Conjunctions

Conjunctions are words that **link thoughts, actions, or ideas** together in a sentence. They can show connections, relationships, or sequences. Here are some examples:

- **and**: adds more information ("I have a cat and a dog.")
- **but**: contrasts two ideas ("She was tired, but she finished her work.")
- **or**: gives a choice ("Do you want tea or coffee?")
- **so**: shows a cause or effect ("It was raining, so I brought an umbrella.")
